

Peace Awards 2021

In its desire to honor those who serve in peace as well as perpetuating the Gospel of Peace. The International College of Peace Studies, has established a series of national honor for Peace awards from since September 2019.

Awards Criteria

The Peace Award, announced annually, is awarded by the select committee of International College of Peace Studies to recognise any outstanding effort by recipients, who has promoted the concept of Community, National, and international understanding and who, in so doing, has made a contribution to world peace.

Eligibility: The Award Committee will recognize the efforts of ordinary people. Those recognized will be both average, and outstanding people who in some special and dedicated manner have made a real contribution to international peace, and local community goodwill. The award may also be granted to individuals and groups who collectively have achieved this aim. You can also nominate yourself, and submit all requirements required by the panelist.

The Award: *The Award itself is a symbolizes of peace love and unity in the fiends of peacemaking, dialogue, and conflict resolutions. The Medallion is accompanied by a miniature silver lapel badge and a certificate setting out the nature of the Prize and the citation on which the award was given.*

Presentation: The Award is normally presented in conjunction with the organization of the Worldwide Encouragement Society Conference.

The Year Awards is annually done to recognize the efforts and achievements of awardees especially those in the field of peace-making, who have given service to their fellow citizens and to the community in a positive, selfless and compassionate of all time!

How and When to Nominate

Nominations

Nominations should be made to the countries, counties, and sub-counties nominees of organizations or individual within the community and cities. Nominations from organizations or individuals with citations/references giving full details of the nominee's service and background should be forwarded to the Chairman of the Peace Award Committee. Nomination forms are available before 20th September 2021.

Judging Panel and Process

The Peace Awards program is a peer review process, based on information supplied in the written entry. The Judges' decision is final. For a The Peace Award to be granted, an entry will satisfy each of the stated criteria at an appropriate level. The Award Committee reserves the right to make changes to the number of awards in each category. Therefore, there is a possibility that no award is granted for a category.

In addition to the Award winners, Letters of Commendation can be requested by a judging panel wishing to recognize quality aspects of an entry and encourage further development.

The Panels

The Peace Awards Judging Panels are responsible for reviewing all award submissions and deciding on the winners. The panel is comprised of a broad spectrum of professional, discipline and service backgrounds, including educational, humanitarian, and security careers, from across Kenya and International. The Service and Program Award Judging Panels are made up of representatives from across a wide range of fields including peace educators, academics and researchers, program coordinators and health workers, to name a few!

These awards are designed so that those men and women, amongst us can be recognized, appreciated, and honoured at a national and international level based on the recognition and nomination both of members of their members organization and also those within the community at which they have major visibly.

Announcement of Awards

The names of the recipients of the Peace Award of the Year will be announced on International Day of Peace on 21st September 2021.

Timelines are as follows:

2. The Award Peace Committee will to review/recommend nominations to the Board
3. Nominations are tabled at the Board Meeting for approval/recommendation and forwarded to National Office.

A chronological list of activities/appointments is insufficient, but important dates should be incorporated into the citation. Advice as to whether the service has been paid employment or unpaid voluntary is also important.

References from at least one and preferably three other supporting persons are essential, particularly when the nominator is closely related to the nominee. Those from public figures (e.g. local members of Parliament, presidents of clubs, local council personages) are ideal.
